- 4. In a deeper sense than the Sunday School "brothers and sisters in Christ" idea, what do you think it means that we are born again into a new family, with fellow followers of Jesus being our siblings?
 - a. Why do so many New Testament writers (and Jesus!) emphasize this reality so frequently?
- 5. What do verses 18 & 19 tell you about the VALUE of our redemption?

- 6. In light of verse 24, is there anything in this life worthy of really pursuing?
 - a. How do we live in the tension of pursuing good things on earth without placing too much value in finite things?
